ELG 01 Listening, Attention & Understanding

- Listen to & talk about stories to build familiarity & understanding
- Listen attentively & respond to what they hear with relevant qu's, comments & actions when being read to & during whole class discussions & small group interactions

- Read loud simple sentences & books that are consistent with their phonic knowledge, inc some common exception words


ELG 10 Writing

- Move energetically, such as running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping & climbing



Mathematics Development

ELG 11 Number

- Count objects, actions and sounds
- Link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value
- Have a deep understanding of numbers to 10, inc the composition of each number
- Subitise (recognise quantities without counting) up to 5
- Automatically recall (without ref to rhymes, counting or other aids) no. bonds up to 5 (inc. subtraction facts) & some no. bonds to 10, inc double facts

ELG 12 Numerical Patterns

- Count beyond ten
- Understand the 'one more than/one less than' relationship between consecutive numbers
- Select rotate & manipulate shapes in order to develop spatial reasoning skills
- Continue, copy and create repeating patterns
- Verbally count beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting system
- Compare quantities up to 10 in different contexts, recognising when one quantity is greater/less than or the same as the other quantity
- Explore & represent patterns within no's up to 10, inc evens & odds, double facts & how quantities can be distributed equally

Expressive Arts & Design

ELG 16 Creating with Materials

- Safely use & explore a variety of materials, tools & techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form & function
- Share their creations, explaining the process they have used
- Make use of props & materials when role playing characters in narratives & stories

ELG 17 Being Imaginative & Expressive

- Listen attentively, move to & talk about music, expressing their feelings & responses
- Watch & talk about dance & performance art, expressing their feelings & responses
