# ELG 01 Listening, Attention & Understanding

- Understand how to listen carefully & why listening is important
- Ask qu's to find out more & to check they understand what has been said to them
- Listen attentively & respond to what they hear with relevant qu's, comments & actions when being read to & during whole class discussions & small group interactions

#### ELG 02 Speaking

- Use new vocabulary through the day
- Articulate their ideas & thoughts in wellformed sentences
- Offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently intro. vocab from stories, non-fiction, rhymes & poems where appropriate

# ELG 08 Comprehension

- Re-read books to build up their confidence in word reading, their fluency and their understanding and enjoyment
- Demonstrate understanding of what has been read to them by retelling stories & narratives in their own words & recently intro. vocab

# ELG 09 Word Reading


- Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter-sound correspondences
- Read a few common exception words matched to the sch's phonic prog.
- Read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending

# ELG 10 Writing

- Spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sound with letter/s
- Write short sentences with words with known letter-sound correspondences using a capital letter & full stop
- Write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed

- Compare numbers

- Have a deep understanding of numbers to 10, inc the composition of each number

- Count beyond ten
- Understand the 'one more than/one less than' relationship between consecutive numbers
- Continue, copy and create repeating patterns
- Verbally count beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting system


